Mounting Hangers and Supports Use vertical threaded rods as hangers, positioning them at intervals that comply with the tray manufacturer's load specifications, typically supporting up to 318-340 kg per hanger with a maximum spacing of 3.6 m. Thread an upper hex nut onto the rod approximately 203 mm (8") above the tray bottom for initial positioning. Place round washers and clamps (single or double ladder clamps) around the tray siderails. Ensure the washer is between the hex nut and the clamp to distribute load evenly. Adjust the tray height by threading the lower hex nut until the tray reaches the desired vertical alignment. Securing the Cable Tray Ensure constant lateral clamping force using clamps with springs or adjustable tension to accommodate thermal expansion and contraction of cables. Avoid closed loops of ferromagnetic steel in the shaft to prevent magnetic interference and maintain high tensile strength. Maintain proper bend radius for cables exiting the tray to prevent conductor stress and insulation damage. For multiple adjacent trays, use double clamps to support them together, ensuring stability and alignment.
