Hanger Types and Connection Methods Cable trays are typically supported using threaded rods, beam clamps, or strut systems. Maximum load per hanger varies by tray type but typically ranges from 318 kg (700 lbs) to 340 kg (750 lbs) (). Always ensure that the tray and hanger system is rated for the total weight of the cables and any additional equipment.

Installation Best Practices Use compatible system components: Trays, fittings, and hangers should be designed to work together to ensure mechanical stability (). Proper alignment: Ensure trays are level and aligned to avoid stress on joints and connections (). Secure connections: Use lock nuts or vibration-resistant fasteners to maintain stability over time (). Corrosion protection: Select appropriate finishes, such as hot-dip galvanization, for wet or industrial environments (). Safe handling: During offloading and installation, avoid using trays as lifting points for forklifts or chains to prevent damage ().
