Cable trays are designed exclusively for electrical, communication, and signal cables; non-electrical pipes or tubing are not permitted. Permitted Use of Cable Trays Cable trays are intended to support electrical conductors, power cables, signal cables, communication cables, and optical fiber cables. According to NEC Section 300-8, mechanical utility piping or tubing containing water, air, gas, drainage, or steam cannot be installed in cable trays that contain electrical conductors. Type MC (Metal-Clad Cable) – often used as an alternative to conduit wiring in industrial settings. Type ITC (Instrumentation Tray Cable) – shielded or unshielded, for instrumentation and control applications. Type MI (Mineral-Insulated, Metal-Sheathed Cable) – highly fire-resistant, used in critical or high-temperature applications. Communication and optical fiber cables – for data and signal transmission. Separation and Safety Considerations When placing multiple types of electrical cables in the same tray, separation is required to prevent electromagnetic interference (EMI) and maintain safety. For example, high-power and low-power cables should be separated, and cable tray barriers may be used to separate conductors operating at different voltage levels. A minimum separation of two inches is generally recommended between power and communication or control cables, though specific requirements depend on cable type and voltage. Summary Non-electrical pipes or tubing are prohibited in cable trays containing electrical conductors. Only approved electrical, signal, and communication cables may be installed.
