Threaded Studs and Inserts Studs with external threads can be screwed into threaded inserts embedded in tray components. This allows for modular assembly and easy disassembly for maintenance or reconfiguration.

Self-Tapping Screws In some lightweight or thin-metal trays, self-tapping screws create their own internal threads as they are driven in. This eliminates the need for pre-tapped holes and speeds up installation.

Material Compatibility: Bolts, nuts, and trays should be made of compatible metals to prevent galvanic corrosion.
