- Turn Off Power:** Ensure the distribution box is de-energized before inspection or repair.
- Inspect and Replace:** Replace the burned ground wire with a properly sized copper wire, ensuring secure connections to the bus bar and mounting plate.
- Verify Bonding:** Confirm that the neutral and ground buses are correctly bonded according to code, and that a continuous path exists back to the main panel.
- Test Ground Resistance:** After repair, measure the resistance between system parts and the central grounding point; it should be below 0.1 Ohm for proper safety.
- Professional Assistance:** Always consult a qualified electrician to ensure compliance with local electrical codes and prevent recurrence.
