Switches actively manage traffic, support higher speeds, and allow multiple devices to connect efficiently. Unlike splitters, switches require power and can handle Gigabit connections, making them a more reliable solution for home or office networks. Practical Setup To use a splitter, you need: A router or switch as the source device. Two splitters: one at the source and one at the destination. Ethernet cables connecting the router to the first splitter, the splitters to each other, and the second splitter to the target devices. In summary, a router or switch is always necessary for a splitter to function because the splitter itself cannot provide or manage a network signal. For better performance a...

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The destination router must have two available ports to use a splitter, which is not always the case. For extending a network connection, it's almost always better to use an Ethernet switch.
