Technological Upgrades and Projects Eastern Europe is adopting modern fiber technologies, including G.652D and G.654C low-loss cables, to enhance network capacity and reliability. Projects like EXA Infrastructure's 1,200 km route connecting London to Frankfurt, Amsterdam, and Brussels demonstrate the trend of integrating terrestrial and subsea fiber to strengthen European digital infrastructure. Operators are also leveraging FTTH/B networks, hybrid fiber-coaxial systems, and micro-trenching techniques to accelerate deployment and reduce costs.
