

Explosion-proof wire for distribution box



Overview

In explosive environments of risk level 1, distribution circuits should use copper core wires or cables. The use of aluminum core cables is not permitted in coal mine. Explosion-proof electrical equipment, such as explosion-proof distribution boxes, is specifically designed for hazardous environments where flammable gases, vapors, or dust may be present. Proper installation, wiring, and usage are critical to ensuring the safety and functionality of these systems. The interior should be free from dust and debris. For zones 1 and 2, the permissible current carrying capacity of the conductor in the explosion-proof box should be no less than 1. Always ask: "Does this need to be here?"
