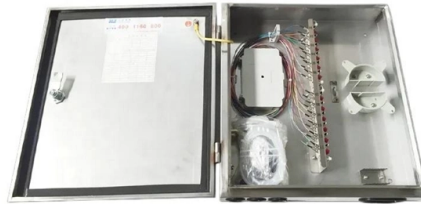


Fiber optic cable core splicing drop wire

Fiber optic drop cable splicing is typically performed using fusion or mechanical splicing to ensure low-loss, reliable connections for FTTH or aerial installations. Fiber Optic Drop Cable Structure Drop cables are designed for connecting the main network to end users, often in FTTH (Fiber to the Home) applications. Common structures include single-core, double-core, or four-core flat figure-8 designs, with the fiber located at the geometric center and reinforced with FRP (Fiber-Reinforced Plastic) or steel for tensile strength and compression resistance. Figure-8 aerial drop cables are self-supporting, with a steel messenger wire integrated for overhead installation. The optical fiber inside usually uses G.657 bend-insensitive fiber, allowing a minimum bend radius of 20 mm, suitable for indoor or aerial routing.

Splicing Methods

Fusion Splicing Fusion splicing is the preferred method for permanent connections. It involves: Precisely aligning the fiber cores using a fusion splicer. Using an electric arc to fuse the glass ends together. Producing a continuous optical path with very low insertion loss (typically 0.01–0.03 dB) and minimal back reflection. Fusion splicing is ideal for new installations or greenfield projects where long-term reliability is critical.

Mechanical Splicing Mechanical splicing uses a self-contained assembly to align two fiber ends with an index-matching gel. It is: Easier and faster to perform. Often used for temporary connections or emergency repairs. Slightly higher loss (0.1–0.3 dB) compared to fusion splicing. Mechanical splicing allows disconnection if needed but is less durable than fusion splicing.

Installation Considerations

Bend Radius: Do not exceed the cable's minimum bend radius to prevent fiber damage.

Tensile Strength: Use approved clamps (e.g., WIREVISE® for Figure-8 cables) to secure the messenger wire without stressing the fiber.

Safety: Always wear safety glasses and gloves, and avoid looking directly into live fibers carrying laser light.
