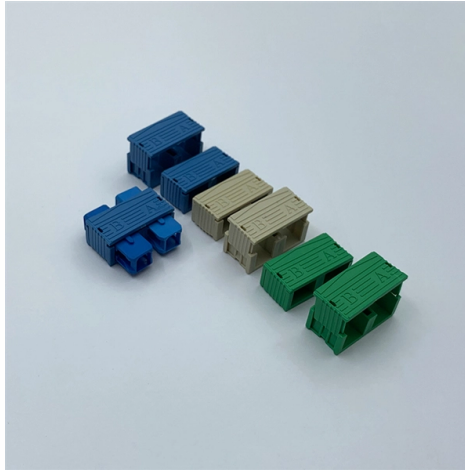


How many circuits are allowed in a distribution box

Typical Domestic Configuration

For a standard 3-bedroom house, a common distribution box setup might include:

- 2 lighting circuits (upstairs/downstairs)
- 2 general socket circuits (upstairs/downstairs)
- 1 cooker circuit
- 1 shower circuit
- 1 smoke alarm circuit
- 1-2 spare ways for future expansion

This configuration can be accommodated in a modern RCBO board with 12-16 ways, providing both safety and room for growth.

Industrial or Commercial Considerations

For larger buildings, the number of circuits depends on the total load, type of equipment, and three-phase supply requirements. Each major system or machinery may require dedicated circuits, and distribution boxes should be sized to allow for proper busbar capacity, neutral and earth bar arrangements, and short-circuit ratings.
