A 200A service with a 42-space panel is standard for most modern homes, while homes over 4,000 sq ft or with all-electric heating may require 320A or 400A service. Never install a panel with fewer than 30 spaces, as this limits flexibility and future upgrades.

Circuit Types and Safety Devices

- General-purpose circuits:** Typically 15–20A for lighting and outlets.
- Dedicated appliance circuits:** Required for high-demand appliances like ovens, dryers, and HVAC units.
- Small appliance branch circuits (SABCs):** NEC mandates at least two in kitchens to handle multiple countertop appliances.
- Safety devices:** Include GFCIs for wet areas, RCDs for earth fault protection, and RCBOs for combined overcurrent and residual current protection.

- Calculate total electrical load:** Multiply your home's square footage by 3 to estimate minimum wattage, then convert to amperage to determine general-purpose circuits.
- Group devices logically:** Avoid placing high-demand appliances on the same circuit to prevent overloads.
