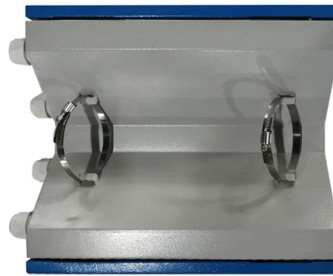

- Devices installed:** Adding switches, outlets, or breakers increases the conductor count for box fill purposes.
