

How to change the router's fiber optic port

- Power on the ONT first, wait for the status lights to stabilize (Power and Optical/PON lights should be solid green or blue).
- Power on the router and check the WAN or Fiber port indicator lights.
- Access the router's admin panel via a web browser (commonly 192.168.1.1 or 192.168.0.1) and enter your ISP credentials if required.
- Configure WAN settings such as PPPoE, DHCP, or static IP according to your ISP instructions.

Step 5: Test the Connection

- Verify that the router receives a stable internet signal.
- Check the status lights on both the ONT and router to confirm...
