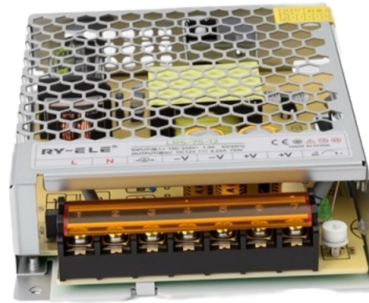

Score the perimeter with a utility knife and cut the opening with a jab saw. Feed the electrical wires through the box's cable entry points.
