

How to thoroughly disinfect and clean the distribution box

Slug Method (optional): Introduce a concentrated chlorine slug and allow at least 3 hours of contact time, then flush with clean water. Ensure all surfaces that may contact water are coated with the chlorine solution.

Step 3: Flushing After the contact period, flush the distribution box thoroughly with clean water until the chlorine residual drops to safe levels (typically 0.2–4.0 mg/L) for potable water systems. Collect the discharged water safely and, if necessary, neutralize residual chlorine using sodium thiosulfate to prevent environmental harm.

Step 4: Verification Test the water or surfaces for residual chlorine and microbial contamination. Samples should be collected from approved points and analyzed in a certified laboratory. Two consecutive passing sa...
