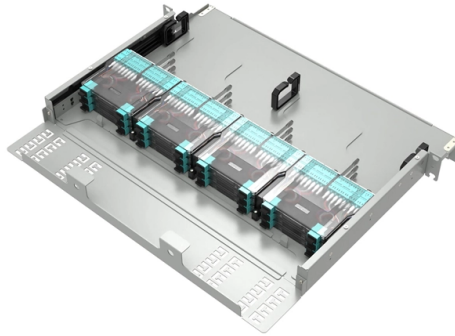


Optical module SMF cannot be used

An SMF optical module cannot be used if the fiber type, switch compatibility, or module certification does not match the network requirements. Fiber Type Mismatch Single-mode fiber (SMF) modules are designed for long-distance transmission using a 9-micron core and wavelengths of 1310 nm or 1550 nm, while multimode fiber (MMF) modules use a larger core (50–62.5 μm) and 850 nm wavelength for short distances. Using an SMF module with MMF cabling, or vice versa, prevents proper light propagation, causing the link to fail or the port to remain inactive. SMF fiber is typically yellow, whereas MMF fiber is orange or aqua, which helps identify the correct pairing. Device and Module Compatibility Switches often require certified optical modules. Non-certified or third-party SMF modules may not be recognized by the device, leading to link failures, abnormal data bus behavior, or interface errors. Cisco and Huawei recommend using only compatible transceivers listed in their respective Optics-to-Device Compatibility Matrices to ensure proper operation. Even if the module is physically inserted, the switch may not detect it, or the interface may not come up. Optical Power and Link Budget SMF modules require a specific optical power budget to maintain signal integrity over long distances. If the received optical power is below the module's sensitivity threshold, issues such as high bit error rates, CRC errors, or unstable links can occur. Proper measurement with an optical power meter is recommended to verify transmit and receive levels. Troubleshooting Steps Verify module recognition: Use switch commands (e.g., `show idprom interface` on Cisco or display transceiver interface on Huawei) to confirm the module is detected. Check fiber type: Ensure the fiber matches the module type (SMF with SMF, MMF with MMF). Confirm certified module: Use only manufacturer-certified SMF modules to avoid structural or electrical incompatibilities. Check optical power: Measure transmit and receive power to ensure it falls within the module's sp...
