

Parallel jumper wires for distribution boxes

What Are Jumper Wires? A jumper wire is a short conductor, typically copper, used to connect two or more points in an electrical circuit. How Jumpers Are Used in Household Panels In a typical scenario, the main switch feeds power to the first circuit breaker, and a jumper wire connects the top of the first breaker to the next breaker, continuing in sequence. This creates a parallel connection where one wire carries the combined current of multiple circuits. In smaller applications, jumpers may also be used to connect outlets in series within a receptacle box.

Hazards and Regulatory Concerns Using jumper wires in household distribution boxes can be dangerous: The wire closest to the main switch carries the sum of currents from all downstream breakers, which can overload the wire without tripping the breakers. Standard household wires (typically 4–6 mm² copper) have limited current capacity (25–32A), which may be exceeded if multiple circuits draw power simultaneously. Overcrowding wires in the distribution box reduces heat dissipation, increasing the risk of overheating and fire. National standards explicitly prohibit jumper connections in residential distribution boxes since 2010 due to these safety risks.

Safe Alternatives Individual wiring: Run a separate wire from the main switch to each circuit breaker, ensuring each wire is sized for its load. Manufacturer-approved jump...
