

Parallel or series connection of relay protection



Overview

When the relays are at rest (normally closed position) the woofer coils are wired in series. Partial voltage when relays are connected in series When used with a DC load, connecting relays in series divides the voltage in two and it may be possible to interrupt a larger voltage than with a single relay. Thus countermeasures to suppress counter electromotive voltage are necessary. Can I parallel the contacts to get an effective 60A relay?

Further, could I parallel two (or more) relays and get even more current capacity?

I see two possible problems. Can I connect the 2 relays in series by supplying 24V DC so that there will be 12V DC drop across each of the 2 relays?

What will be the behaviour of the relay coils, and the reverse coil voltages when connected in series?

Relays in series connection?

Both relays need 12V to reliably operate the coil, in series they will only get 6V. So, no this is not a good idea. The best is to connect them in parallel and they will operate at the same time.

Can two relays be connected in series or parallel?

To prevent this, it is necessary to use a relay with a rating that has a margin in excess of the circuit current, or install a current sensor or fuse in the current line of each relay to prevent
