

Requirement for the ground clearance of the distribution box



AI Overview

The minimum ground clearance for a distribution box is typically 6.5 feet (≈ 2 meters) of headroom in front, with the panelboard mounted no higher than 6 feet 7 inches (≈ 2 meters) above the floor. Mounting Height and Working Space Distribution boxes, including panelboards and breaker boxes, must be installed in a readily accessible location. The mounting height should not exceed 6 ft 7 in (≈ 2 meters) from the floor to the top of the panel to ensure safe operation and maintenance. The dedicated working space in front of the box must provide a minimum depth of 3 feet (≈ 914 mm) and a width of at least 30 inches (≈ 762 mm) or the width of the equipment, whichever is greater. This ensures that doors can open fully to 90 degrees and that personnel have sufficient room to work safely.

Headroom and Clearance The headroom in front of the distribution box must be at least 6.5 feet (≈ 2 meters), measured from the floor or platform to the ceiling or any overhead obstruction. This clearance allows electricians to work without crouching and provides a safe escape path in case of an electrical fault. For higher voltage systems, additional clearance may be required to reduce shock hazards.

Additional Safety Considerations

Side clearance: Maintain at least 30 inches (≈ 762 mm) from the sides of the box or the width of the equipment, whichever is greater.

Obstructions: The working space must remain free of storage, pipes, or other equipment.

Grounding: Each distribution box must be properly grounded according to local standards, typically using a 10 AWG (US) or 6 mm² (other markets) ground wire connected to the mounting plate and central grounding point.

Summary To comply with NEC and safety standards, a distribution box should be mounted no higher than 6 ft 7 in (≈ 2 meters), with a minimum front working clearance of 3 feet (≈ 914 mm), side clearance of 30 inches...
