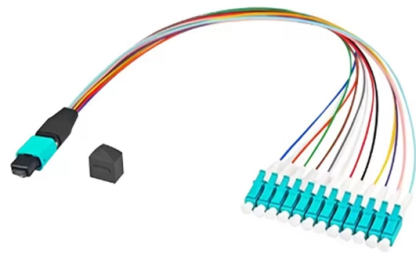

- Weathered rock or gravel:** Lay a 5 cm mortar layer followed by fine gravel or sand to prevent abrasion.
- Trench bottom:** Should be flat and free of debris to avoid cable damage.

Cable Type Considerations

- Armored cables:** Can be buried directly without conduit and withstand higher soil pressures (50–200 kN/m²), suitable for depths of 1.0–1.5 meters.
- Unarmored cables:** Typically require conduits and shallower burial (0.6–0.9 meters) to prevent crushing or moisture ingress.

Additional Recommendations

- Frost protection:** In cold climates, bury below the frost line (often 1.0–1.2 meters) to prevent frost heave.
- Flood-prone areas:** Increase depth to 1.2–1.5 meters to avoid water pressure damage.
- Urban sidewalks and villages:** Minimum 1.0 meter, with adj...

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Engineer's Note: LSZH armoured cables are mandatory in many infrastructure projects, especially metro systems and airports, to meet fire safety and evacuation requirements.
