- Fault isolation:** If a fault occurs in one box or feeder, the rest of the chain can continue supplying power, minimizing outages.
- Simplified cabling:** By placing secondary boxes close to load centers, cable lengths are minimized, reducing losses and installation costs.

Typical Configuration

- Primary Transformer:** Steps down MV to LV at the substation or secondary unit substation.
- Secondary Distribution Box (Panel):** Receives LV power and distributes it to local loads. These boxes may include busbars, breakers, and monitoring devices.
- Chain Connection:** Secondary boxes are connected in a radial or selective radial configuration, where each box can be fed from the previous one or from a secondary bus tie. This allows automatic or manual switching in case of a fault.
- Protective Devices:** Fuses, breakers, or reclosers protect each box and feeder from overloads or short circuits.
