Slovenia's five main electricity distribution companies—Elektro Primorska, Elektro Ljubljana, Elektro Gorenjska, Elektro Celje, and Elektro Maribor—are actively modernizing the low-voltage network. By 2026, they plan to construct approximately 1,300 kilometers of low-voltage lines and install 838 transformer stations equipped with smart grid components. These upgrades aim to support renewable energy integration, heat pumps, e-mobility, and improved network resilience.

Integration with Smart Grid Technologies

Modern LV distribution boxes in Slovenia are increasingly designed to interface with smart grid systems, enabling real-time monitoring, load management, and enhanced reliability. This is part of a broader investment exceeding €150 million, partially funded by the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (NRRP), to modernize...
