The bare fiber end is spliced to the main fiber line, while the square connector end plugs into equipment.

Data centers and high-density racks: Square connectors provide secure, space-efficient connections. Splicing and patching: Tail fibers are used to terminate multi-core cables or connect to optical boards.

Variants Tail fibers can be single-mode or multimode, with different core sizes and transmission distances. Single-mode fibers (yellow jacket) are used for long-distance transmission, while multimode fibers (orange jacket) are suitable for shorter distances. Connector types compatible with SC heads include SC/PC, SC/APC, and SC-LC, depending on the network equipment.
