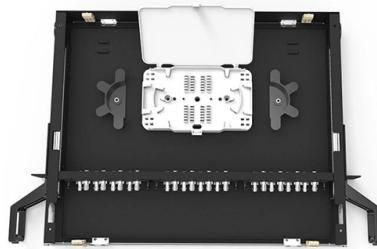

This requires reversing the fiber strands between the two SFP ports to ensure proper signal flow. Using pre-terminated duplex LC cables simplifies this process, while bulk fiber requires careful termination with LC connectors. Module and Cable Compatibility Select the correct SFP module based on the fiber type and distance. Multimode fiber is suitable for runs under 1000 feet, while single-mode fiber is used for longer distances. Connector type must match the module (commonly LC connectors). Avoid non-compatible or third-party SFPs on certain switches, as this can cause link instability or errors. Installation Tips Identify the switch port type (SFP, SFP+, QSFP) and ensure the module matches the port and network speed. Insert the transceiver module securely into the switch port. Clean fiber connectors before connecting to prevent signal loss. Connect the duplex fiber cable, ensuring TX and RX are correctly aligned between devices. Verify link status on the...
