- 4. Wire Mesh (Basket) Cable Tray** Wire mesh trays, also called basket trays, are made from welded steel wires, forming a flexible, lightweight structure. They are easy to install and modify on-site, making them ideal for low-voltage, data, and telecom cables in office buildings and IT networks.
- 5. Channel Cable Tray** Channel trays are U-shaped or C-shaped and provide support for smaller cable runs or branch connections. They are often used where visual aesthetics are important or for short cable runs from main trays to equipment. They can have solid or ventilated bottoms depending on the application.
