Unlike copper wires, which are limited by lower data transmission speeds, shorter transmission distances, and higher susceptibility to electromagnetic interference, fiber optic cables offer unparalleled performance and can. Commonly referred to as figure 8 cable, figure 8 fiber cable, figure 8 aerial cable, self-supporting figure 8 cable, or simply figure 8 optical cable, this ingenious structure combines optical fibers with an integrated messenger wire in a distinctive “8” cross-section.
