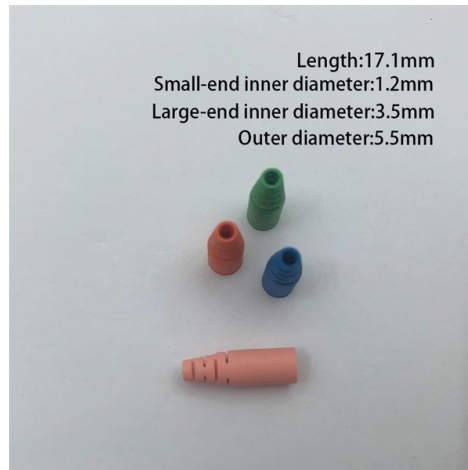


What height should the workshop electrical distribution box be

The minimum height is often dictated by practical considerations, such as avoiding water damage and maintaining clear working space, with a typical minimum of 3 to 4 feet (0.9 to 1.2 meters) from the floor. Working Space Requirements A clear working space of at least 36 inches (0.9 meters) in front of the panel and a width of 30 inches (0.76 meters) or the width of the equipment, whichever is greater, is required to allow safe operation and maintenance. The vertical clearance should extend from the floor to at least 6.5 feet (2 meters) or the height of the equipment, whichever is greater. Additional Considerations Place the box in a dry, ventilated, and accessible area to prevent damage and allow easy maintenance. Avoid locations near wet areas, flammable materials, or high-traffic zones to reduce safety risks. Ensure the panel door can open fully to 90 degrees without obstruction.
