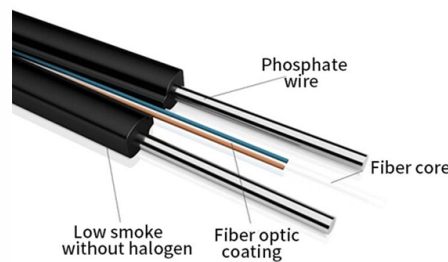


What is the size of the wall penetration hole for the cable tray

Cover plates: Use square, consistent cover plates to close the opening after installation, ensuring no visible cracks or voids. Practical Installation Tip When planning the wall penetration, measure the cable tray's outside dimensions (including side rails) and add the required firestop clearance. For a tray with a nominal width of 300 mm and height of 50 mm, the wall opening might typically be approximately 320–330 mm wide and 70–80 mm high, depending on the firestop system used. This ensures proper sealing, compliance with fire safety standards, and ease of installation. By following these guidelines, the wall penetration will safely accommodate the cable tray while maintaining fire protection and structural integrity.

Fill Limits: For power cables, the fill must not exceed 40% of the tray's cross-sectional area; for control cables, it's 50%. Separation: High-power and low-power cables must be separated

B-Line series Cable Tray Design Considerations

For ladder or ventilated trough trays, the total sum of the cross-sectional areas of all the cables to be installed in the cable tray must be equal to or less than the allowable cable area for the tray width, as

The entire amount of the cross-sectional areas for all of the single conductor cables that are going to be positioned in the cable tray needs to be equal to or less than the permissible cable
