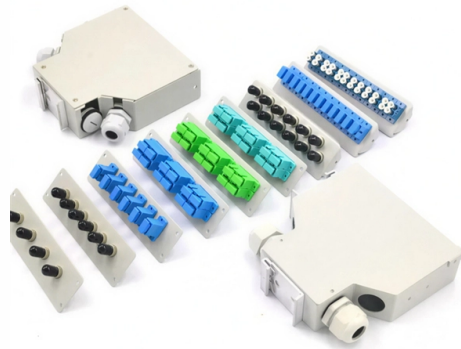

In North America, a standard breaker box receives split-phase power with two “hot” lines (L1 and L2), each providing 120V AC. Circuits connected from L1 or L2 to neutral deliver 120V, while double-pole breakers spanning L1 and L2 provide 240V for high-power appliances.
