Choose the right box based on environment (indoor/outdoor), load capacity, and durability. Check for proper IP/NEMA ratings and material quality. Most modern secondary networks are operated at AC rated voltage of 100-120 or 230-240 volts, at the frequency of 50 or 60 hertz. Operating voltage, required number of phases (three-phase or single-phase) and required reliability dictate topology and configuration of the network. Ensure safe placement: install in dry, accessible areas with good ventilation and at appropriate height (typically ~1. Practice good wiring: secure.
