Main Supply Connection: The incoming phase and neutral lines from the utility or energy meter are first connected to the main isolator or main MCB. From there, the wires are routed to protective devices like RCCBs or RCDs, which safeguard against leakage currents and electric shocks ().

Distribution to Subcircuits: After passing through protective devices, the phase wires are connected in parallel to individual MCBs, while neutral wires are connected to a neutral bus bar. Each MCB then feeds a specific circuit, such as lighting, outlets, or appliances ().

Wire Management: Wires exiting the distribution box should be neatly organized, properly insulated, and secured to prevent mechanical damage. Color coding (e.g., red or brown for phase, blue for neutral, green/yellow for ground) is used to avoid confusion and ensure safety ().

Safety and Compliance

Protection Devices: Each outgoing wire should be protected by an appropriate MCB or fuse to prevent overcurrent or short circuits. RCCBs provide additional protection against leakage currents ().

Labeling: Clearly label each wire or circuit to identify its destination, which simplifies maintenance and troubleshooting ().
